Soroptimist International Convention in Dublin, Ireland

Four members from our Club attended the Soroptimist International Dublin Ireland Convention in July. Those attending were Cheri Richardson, Carolyn Roberts, Pat Murdoch and Rita Offrett. A logo change was announced by Soroptimist International. They called it an emblem refresh. They said the change was to more accurately represent what we intend to focus on in the next 100 years, which is working with the United Nations toward sustainable development goals: gender equal-

but they will still be asking for donations on December 10th which will now be called The Soroptimist International Foundation Day. This day will encourage others around the world to get involved in raising funds and donating them to the foundation. They say moving to a charitable foundation will enable Soroptimist International to have more flexibility while having more control at the same time.

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We now have FIVE Federations - Soroptimist of the Americas, Soroptimist of Ireland and Great Britain, Soroptimist of Asian Pacific, Soroptimist of Europe, and now Soroptimist of Africa. This was the first international convention to be held since Africa became the fifth federation. It was fun to see the enthusiasm of the African members at the convention.

Mary Robinson, first female President of Ireland and former UN High Commissioner for Human Rights, and Chair of the Elders - an independent group of global leaders founded by Nelson Mandela working for peace, justice, human rights, and a sustainable planet. Her speech was "Women Leaders must step up and lead as never before." She was very powerful and a very dynamic speaker. She spoke on climate crisis. "Climate change is a man-made problem that requires a feminist solution." She also talked about Project Dandelion

They announced that the President's Appeal has been changed and introduced as a new Soroptimist International Foundation. In the past, the President's Appeal has been a focus chosen by the SI

president during her term and has existed since 1981. It is being replaced with The Soroptimist International Foundation which was established this year. We are still learning what this will mean to us,

Jim Gamble, CEO, Ineqe Safegarding Group, spoke on "It is not about the technology." He stated that technology is great, but we have to safeguard ourselves and especially our children. He talked about the predatory cases he had worked on and shared how we can talk with our children about this issue for them online. He said he wants all children, especially to know there is hope. He said too many of the children pulled into the dark web by these predators then commit suicide. He stated the opportunity is when there is a case in the news to talk to our children in the third party by asking if anyone, they know at school has sent nude pictures of themselves that are now all over their school. He wants us to tell them there is hope and to contact the authorities in your area. This makes it easier if it is a child, you know that has become involved can talk to you about it and get the authorities to clean up the web for that child and they will know there is HOPE.

Fall District I & II Meeting


Saturday, September 23rd in Evanston, Wyoming – Holiday Inn Express


