

Trauma Informed Practices

As we work with women and girls in our Soroptimist activities, we must be aware that many have experienced adverse childhood experiences (ACEs) or even as an adult. People who have experienced ACEs may show signs such as the behaviors listed in the visual, some causes are also listed.


There are many ideas for managing developmental trauma that we can emphasize through our teaching and interactions with women, girls, and each other.

Here are some strategies to help:

- Seek professional help: Consult with a therapist or counselor who specializes in trauma.
- Practice self-care: Engage in activities that promote relaxation and stress reduction, such as meditation, yoga, or deep breathing exercises.
- Build a support network: Surround yourself with people who understand and support you.
- Develop coping skills: Learn healthy coping mechanisms, such as journaling, creative expression, or mindfulness.
- Prioritize physical health: Regular exercise, healthy eating, and sufficient sleep can help regulate your mood.

Remember, healing from developmental trauma takes time, patience, and support. Be gentle with yourself and others.
