We heard from Ashlie, Wendy, Thaianne and Jazmyn. Teresa shared Mariya's story as she was unable to attend due to the medical needs of her son.

Each of these women have faced tremendous obstacles and challenges including domestic violence, incarceration, poverty, teen pregnancy, and children with mental and physical disabilities. Each found the strength to rise-up and move forward recognizing the importance of continuing their education to provide a better life for their children.

Lealai planned to attend however due to extreme pain from colorectal surgery, she was unable to attend. She sent this message following the event: "Thank you so much for keeping me and kids in mind in everything, all support is greatly appreciated in our little big family. I am truly grateful for Soroptimist for all the support, it meant so much to me and my babies. We're going through so much but I'm so hopeful it's all going to be so much better in time. We were evicted recently from our last home but luckily, we got into a small apartment just down the street so that the kids are still sheltered and go to their schools and daycare as I push through this trucking school for

a few more weeks. We will see a better tomorrow soon. I appreciate you."
